

SBIZ INCLUSIVE FINTECH SCHOLARSHIP FOR THE MASTER OF FINANCIAL TECHNOLOGY PROGRAMME

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. The scholarship is open to incoming and current students in the Master of Financial Technology programme under the School of Business.
2. Applicant must demonstrate evidence of academic excellence in the Fintech related domain, such as a strong academic record or standardised test scores, meet the language proficiency requirements of the chosen programme (e.g., English, Mandarin), exhibit leadership qualities and a commitment to community service or social impact.
3. The Scholarship is valued at S\$25,000 and will be used to offset the recipient's tuition fees during the remaining candidature of study (within the normal candidature period).
4. There is no bond attached to the scholarship. Scholars are not allowed to request for a deferment of the scholarship.
5. Scholars shall maintain a cumulative grade point average (CGPA) of at least 3.8 in every semester and act as ambassadors for inclusive Fintech and for the scholarship program.
6. Scholars are expected to actively engage in Fintech activities, including sharing their ideas and collaborating with peers.
7. The scholarship may not, without the prior approval of SUSS, be held concurrently with any other awards.
8. The recipient is required to sit for all examinations, complete the programme within the prescribed time and conform to regulations, instructions and discipline in force for the programme.
9. If a scholarship recipient withdraws or fails any of the Programme courses and is required to re-sit an examination and/or repeat the withdrawn or failed Programme courses, he/she shall pay the relevant course and/ or examination fee(s).
10. SUSS reserves the right to withdraw or suspend the scholarship at any time if, in its opinion, the recipient's conduct or academic performance has not been satisfactory.

11. SUSSE reserves the right to amend the terms and conditions for the scholarship award at its sole discretion.
12. Applicants are required to submit the following supporting documents separately to SUSSE via email for the application:
 - Academic transcripts and certificates
 - A personal statement outlining academic and career aspirations and how the scholarship will help achieve them
 - Two letters of recommendation from academic or professional referees
 - Proof of language proficiency
13. Shortlisted applicants will be notified to attend an interview (virtual or in-person).

The decision of the Student Awards Committee of SUSSE is final and binding, and no reasons will be given for the non-selection of unsuccessful candidates. No appeals will be entertained.
