

Ang Yew Shen Study Award (FULL-TIME UNDERGRADUATES)

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. The Ang Yew Shen Study Award is open to all final year School of Business (SBIZ) full-time undergraduates (Year 3 students going on to Year 4, at point of application).
- 2. Applicants must be Singapore Citizens or Permanent Residents and achieve at least a cumulative Grade Point Average of between 2.5 to 3.7 at point of study grant application.
- 3. One (1) study award of S\$3,000 will be disbursed in each academic year to a student with financial needs.
- 4. Preference will be given to student with household per capita income below \$2,500 and with the most improved CGPA at the end of Year 4.
- 5. Shortlisted candidates are required to attend an in-person group briefing by the donor. They are also encouraged to initiate one-to-one engagements with the donor throughout the year.
- 6. There is no bond attached to the study award.
- 7. The study award may not, without the prior approval of SUSS, be held concurrently with any other bursaries, study grants and/or scholarships¹.
- 8. SUSS reserves the right to amend the terms and conditions for the study award at its sole discretion without any prior notice.
- Students are required to submit their supporting documents together with the e-application. Applications
 received without the necessary supporting documents will be deemed as incomplete and will not be
 processed.
- 10. Study grant application must be submitted by the stipulated deadline. Recipients are not allowed to request for deferment of the study grant.
- 11. Only successful applicants shall be notified via MyMail. The decision of SUSS is final and no appeal will be entertained.

¹ Students who are awarded bursaries/study grants/scholarships, which are meant to cover the tuition fees only, can concurrently hold this study award. Students who are holding awards or bursaries that are meant for specific programmes on top of the tuition fees and living expenses, such as bursaries meant for participation in overseas exchange programmes, can also concurrently hold this study award.
