

## TAN SRI (DR.) TAN CHIN TUAN SCHOLARSHIP (FULL-TIME SOCIAL WORK PROSPECTIVE STUDENTS)

## **TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

- 1. The Tan Sri (Dr.) Tan Chin Tuan Scholarship is open to prospective students (new students) who intend to pursue the full-time Bachelor of Social Work programme at the SUSS' S R Nathan School of Human Development.
- 2. Applicants must be Singapore Citizens with good academic and co-curricular activities records, active participation in community service and possess strong language skills. In addition, applicants should have a monthly household Per Capita Income (PCI) of S\$2,250 or lower. Priority will be given to students with financial difficulties.
- 3. The tenure of this Scholarship is 2 academic years, and eligible students may re-apply for the Scholarship for another 2 years, subject to academic merit and financial need.
- 4. Each award is S\$8,000 per year for two years and is to be used within the next 2 academic years (4 semesters) to offset the recipient's tuition fees, or expenses for regional immersion programme or other educational activities organised by the SUSS.
- 5. Scholarship recipients are not required to serve a bond with the University. They may not concurrently hold any other scholarship, fellowship, award or allowance without prior approval from the University.
- 6. Recipients are required to sit for all examinations, complete the programme within the prescribed time and conform to regulations, instructions and discipline in force for the respective programme. In addition, scholars must have good conduct and **maintain at least a cumulative Grade Point Average of 3.8** in order to re-apply for the Scholarship.
- 7. Recipients will be required to take part in university's activities/events, and community involvement projects as deemed appropriate and/or directed by the University.
- 8. Recipients will be recommended and encouraged to:
  - a. Volunteer with the Donor during his/her studies or after graduation;
  - b. Submit one report to the Donor of at least one of their attachments or internships at charities during the course of their studies in the University; and
  - c. Attend the annual Donor's Scholarship Reception (Tête-à-Tête @ TCTF).
- 9. Applicants must submit admission e-application to SUSS separately and must have already been accepted for admission before being awarded the scholarship.
- 10. Scholarship application must be submitted online by the stipulated deadline, together with all relevant supporting documents. Shortlisted candidates will be notified to attend an interview. The decision of the University on the selection of scholarship candidates is final and no appeal will be entertained.



- 11. The University reserves the right to withdraw or suspend the scholarship at any time if, in its opinion, the recipient's conduct and/or academic performance has not been satisfactory.
- 12. The University reserves the right to amend the above terms and conditions at its sole discretion without prior notice.

A separate letter and agreement with the detailed terms and conditions (including the above terms and conditions) and others relating to the course of study will be given to all successful scholarship candidates.
