

SUSS-SAFRA SPONSORSHIP

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. The Sponsorship is open to new and current SUSS students pursuing part-time undergraduate programmes, Bachelor of Laws, or graduate programmes (Master's, PhD and Doctoral programmes only).
- 2. The Sponsorship is open to all SAFRA Ordinary A (except NSFs) and Ordinary B members. Applicants must have completed full-time National Service. Full-time National Servicemen (NSFs) under Ordinary A seeking to apply for study in any of the stated educational institutions will also be considered if they are in their last year of service and/or whose Operationally-ready Date (ORD) fall at least three (3) months before the start date of the applied course.
- 3. Applicants must have good academic and co-curricular records, strong language skills and demonstrate leadership qualities.
- 4. Applicants who are currently applying for admission to the part-time undergraduate programmes (or existing part-time undergraduates) must not already be degree holders.
- 5. Members who are exempted from in-camp training will not be eligible to apply for the scheme.
- 6. The Sponsorship covers course fees for the entire programme of study, up to the values indicated below:

^{*} For PhD / Doctoral programmes, 50% sponsorship is applicable only to coursework part of the programme



- 7. Sponsorship recipients are not required to serve a bond with SUSS or SAFRA.
- 8. Prospective students must separately seek admission to the programme and must be accepted for admission before being awarded the Sponsorship.
- 9. Applicants are allowed to apply for only one Sponsorship or Scholarship at any one time.
- 10. The Sponsorship may not, without the prior approval of SUSS, be held concurrently with any other awards.
- 11. The recipient is required to sit for all examinations, complete the programme within the prescribed time and conform to regulations, instructions and discipline in force for the respective programme. In addition, for continuation of the sponsorship, the recipient is required to maintain at least a Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) of 3.0 for part-time undergraduate programmes, or a CGPA of 3.5 for the Bachelor of Laws, or a CGPA of 3.8 for graduate programmes.
- 12. SUSS reserves the right to withdraw or suspend the Sponsorship at any time if, in its opinion, the recipient's conduct or academic performance has not been satisfactory.
- 13. Applicants are required to submit copies of educational certificates, transcripts, pay slip and other supporting documents together with the Sponsorship application. Otherwise, the application would be considered incomplete and will not be processed.
- 14. Sponsorship application for **January semester** / **July semester** must be submitted by <u>15</u> <u>September / 15 March</u> respectively. Recipients are not allowed to request for deferment of the Sponsorship award.
- 15. The decision of SUSS and SAFRA on the selection of sponsorship candidates is final and no appeal will be entertained.
- 16. SUSS and SAFRA reserve the right to amend the terms and conditions for the Sponsorship award at their sole discretion without prior notice.

A separate letter and agreement with the detailed terms and conditions (including the above terms and conditions) and others relating to the course of study will be given to all successful applicants.
