

SINGAPORE UNIVERSITY OF SOCIAL SCIENCES STUDY GRANTS

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. The study grants are open to all new and current students enrolled in the following programmes:
 - Master of Gerontology
2. Applicants must be Singapore citizens or permanent residents with financial needs and have good academic and co-curricular activities records.
3. The value of each study grant is **S\$2,000**. It is awarded based on applicant's Per Capital Income (PCI)¹.
4. Study grant recipients are not required to serve a bond with Singapore University of Social Sciences (SUSS) but are expected to make satisfactory academic progress. Recipients are not allowed to request for deferment of the study grant.
5. Prospective students must meet the admission requirements for the applied course of study. They must separately seek admission to the programme (i.e., submit the online admission application) and must be accepted for admission before being awarded the study grant.
6. The study grant will be accorded once to eligible student throughout his/her candidature. Thus, students who had previously received the study grant need not re-apply.
7. The study grant may not, without the prior approval of the University, be held concurrently with any other awards.
8. SUSS reserves the right to amend the terms and conditions for the study grant at its sole discretion without any prior notice.
9. Applicants are required to submit their [supporting documents](#) together with the study grant e-application. Incomplete applications will not be processed.
10. The study grant is open for application only in July semester. All applications must be submitted by **31 March**. Late applications will not be considered.

¹ PCI = $\frac{\text{Gross income of family members in household}}{\text{Total number of family members in household}}$

Gross income refers to amount before deduction of CPF. It includes allowances, overtime, commission, bonus, etc.

For Unmarried Students:

- (i) Immediate family members include parents who may or may not be living together with the student.
- (ii) Non-immediate family members include grandparents, siblings, spouses of siblings, siblings of parents, and any other relatives living together with the student.

For Married Students:

- (i) Immediate family members include spouse and all children who may or may not be living together with the student.
- (ii) Non-immediate family members include parents, grandparents, siblings, spouses of siblings, siblings of parents, and any other relatives living together with the student.
