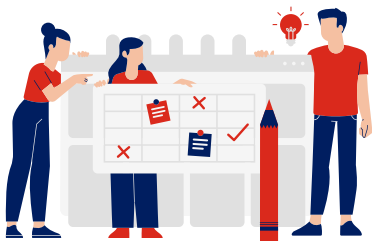

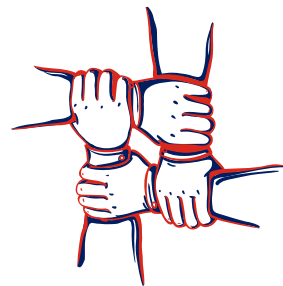

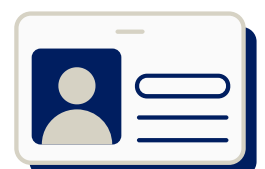


6 Concession Card

MATRICULATION STEP-BY-STEP GUIDE

Key steps in the matriculation process

Online matriculation will take place from **15 Jun (Mon) to 24 Jul (Fri)**. All incoming full-time undergraduate programme students must be matriculated officially before commencing your studies in SUSS. The full step-by-step guide will be made available from 15 Jun (Mon) onwards.

01 Log in to the Matriculation Portal

You will be notified via an email sent to your personal email address to complete matriculation on the Matriculation Portal from 15 Jun (Mon) onwards.

02 Upload your photo

The photo will be used for your SUSS e-Student Card and the Undergraduate Concession Card. Make sure you follow the submission guidelines to avoid a delay in receiving your student card.

03 Course Registration

Courses in Year 1 Semester 1 will be pre-assigned to students without the need to register for them. You will be able to see the list of courses for your first semester in this step. Refer to page 15 to find out if you are eligible for credit exemption.

04 Submitting Bank Details

You are required to provide your bank details to enable monetary transfers from the University to you throughout your course of study.

05 Review your course fees

You can review your course fees for the first semester at the stage. No payment is required at this stage. More details regarding payment can be found on page 36.



Note: To facilitate the matriculation process, you are strongly encouraged to read the Online Matriculation Step-by-Step Guide that will be made available from 15 Jun onwards, for detailed instructions of each step of the process.

Student Card

As a student of SUSS, you will receive an Undergraduate Concession Card, which also serves as your student card. Being a full-time undergraduate, you are eligible for concessionary travel under the Tertiary Student Concessionary Scheme.

The collection details for the concession card will be announced in August via SUSSConnect.

Application Procedure for Concession Card

1. You will be required to submit a passport size photo as part of the online matriculation process. Please take note of the specification of the photo at the point of matriculation. You will be required to resubmit a new photo if it does not meet the above requirements. Please note that you may only submit your photo once.
2. Once your photo has been successfully submitted, SUSS will submit your details to SimplyGo. If you wish to change your photo after submission, you will need to request a replacement through SimplyGo at your own cost.
3. You will be required to submit an application to SimplyGo to request a physical card. Students are advised to verify their application eligibility via the following link before applying: https://svc.simplygo.com.sg/eservice/econcession/tertiary_enquiry.php.

Once you confirm your eligibility, please submit your application through the application channels according to the timeline below:

A non-refundable card cost of \$5 and a processing fee of \$3.10 are payable at the point of application. A receipt will be issued upon successful application, and students should retain it as proof of payment.

Timetable – SBIZ & SWSD

Your timetable will be pre-allocated for July 2026 Semester (Year 1, Semester 1). You may not necessarily be assigned to these courses in Semester 1. Keep a lookout for your timetable via SUSSTConnect from **17 Jul (Fri)** onwards. Classes begin on the week of **10 Aug (Mon)**.

You are encouraged to check SUSSTConnect and your Learnova or Canvas account regularly for updated information about your classes. Study materials will be published on Learnova or Canvas a few weeks before the term begins.

Course mode for all programmes is face-to-face. Unless stated otherwise, all courses are in Day mode. Free Electives, Minor, or repeated courses are held in the evening.



Personal Development Experience

The Personal Development Experience (PDE) is a graduation requirement for all SUSS Full-Time undergraduate students, which must be completed within their first academic year.

Personal Development Experience comprises of the following 3 components:

1. **Experiential Teambuilding (ETB) Programme**
2. **Student Success Centre (SSC) Learning Prospectus[^]**
3. **Freshmen Pulse Check[^]**

1. Experiential Teambuilding (ETB) Programme

ETB provides an experiential platform for all full-time undergraduate students to kick-start their university journey through a common experience. Students can look forward to various experiential activities designed to promote cohesion and collaboration, while deepening their understanding of self, team, community and SUSS values.

Students must attend one of the following ETB runs:

- Run 1: 14 Jul 2026 – 16 Jul 2026
- Run 2: 15 Jul 2026 – 17 Jul 2026
- Run 3: 22 Jul 2026 – 24 Jul 2026
- Run 4: 23 Jul 2026 – 25 Jul 2026

*Note: Students who receive their offer letter after **6 July 2026** are advised to contact the ETB administrators at studentlife@suss.edu.sg to explore the possibility of joining Run 3 or 4. Alternatively, they may be scheduled to attend the ETB programme in 2027. More information will be shared with these students via email in the January 2027 semester.

Registration will open from:

- **15 Jun (Mon) 2026, 12pm to 26 Jun (Fri) 2026, 12pm (For JAP W1)**
- **29 Jun (Mon) 2026, 12pm to 06 Jul (Mon) 2026, 12pm (For JAP W2)**

The registration process comprises of 2 phases:

a) Phase 1: Course Registration and Health Declaration Period

Students must complete a health declaration and select their ETB run. Run selection is on a first-come-first serve basis.

b) Phase 2: Medical Clearance Period

Students with declared medical conditions must obtain medical clearance before attending ETB, which may involve a visit to a doctor.

Students must clear these two phases before attending their selected ETB run.

2. Student Success Centre (SSC) Learning Prospectus[^]

The SSC Learning Prospectus aims to help students develop personal competencies in the domains of 'Unique Individual' and 'Care for Self and Others'.

3. Freshmen Pulse Check[^]

A post-first-semester check-in designed as a touchpoint to better understand how new students are coping and to foster a supportive environment during their transition into university life at SUSS.

3.1. Safety is a priority for the ETB programme. All students must complete their Health Declaration via the registration portal during Phase 1: Course Registration and Health Declaration Period.

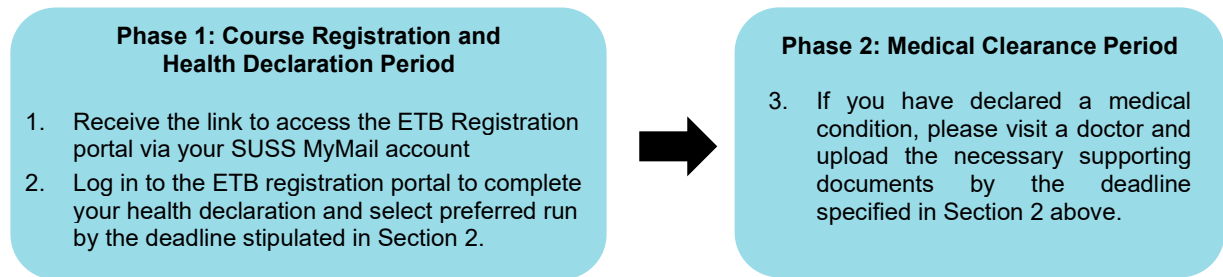
3.2. In Phase 2: Medical Clearance Period, students with declared medical conditions must visit a doctor and provide the necessary supporting documents before participating in ETB. More details on the health declaration process and required documents will be provided during registration.

3.3. SUSS Student Life (STL) will review the supporting documents within 5 working days.

3.4. Students are required to visit a doctor are strongly encouraged to do so as soon as possible after completing their Health Declaration, as students will not be allowed to attend ETB until the relevant supporting documents are submitted and cleared by STL.

4.2. Students' participation for ETB will be confirmed only upon completion of the above registration steps by the respective deadlines.

5. PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT EXPERIENCE REQUIREMENTS

5.1. To clear the Personal Development Experience graduation requirement, you must complete the following components:

- a) ETB Programme
 - Attendance for the ETB programme is compulsory. Absences or requests for early dismissal must be supported by valid reasons and are subject to approval.
 - Actively participate in the ETB programme
 - Pass the ETB Course Quiz
- b) SSC Learning Prospectus
 - Attend at least one workshop from 'Unique Individual' or 'Care for Self and Others' domain during your first academic year. More details will be shared during ETB.
- c) Freshmen Pulse Check
 - Participate in a check-in after your first semester to reflect and share your experiences. This aims to support your transition into university life and help us better understand how to support you. More details will be shared during ETB.

Application of Student's Pass for International Students

All full-time international students are required to hold a valid Student's Pass issued by the Singapore Immigration & Checkpoints Authority (ICA). Your offer of admission to SUSS is conditional upon your successful application of your Student's Pass. Please refer to the requirements via [ICA's website](#).

SUSS will submit all international student names in ICA's SOLAR system. Once submitted, you will be notified to apply for your Student's Pass via ICA's SOLAR system. Upon approval, you will be issued the In-Principle Approval (IPA) letter, which you need to download and print from the SOLAR system.

Before you can be issued with the Student's Pass, you are required by ICA to undergo a medical examination which includes tests for Tuberculosis and the Human Immuno-deficiency Virus (HIV). Upon clearing this medical examination and certified fit to study in Singapore, you will be issued with a medical report. Please submit your medical report online via ICA SOLAR for the completion of the Student's Pass formalities with ICA.

If you do not pass the medical examination, you will not be granted admission to SUSS and must return to your home country at your own expense. Once you have recovered from treatment, your re-application for a Student Pass will be subjected to ICA's review again and there is no confirmation that you will be granted the pass in time to enrol in the programme before it commences in your desired enrolment intake. Please refer to the requirements on ICA's website.

For international students who do not require an entry visa to Singapore, you will only need to show your passport and disembarkation card to get through Singapore immigration.

For international students who require an entry visa to Singapore, the IPA letter will serve as a single-trip entry visa upon arrival in Singapore. Please show your passport, disembarkation card and the IPA letter to the Duty Officer at the Immigration Checkpoint when arriving Singapore. You will be issued a short-term Social Visit Pass.

Overstaying is a punishable offence under the Immigration Act. You are to take note of the expiry dates of the IPA letter/Social Visit Pass and complete the formalities in getting the Student's Pass before the period of stay expires. It is also your responsibility to apply for an extension of the Student's Pass at least one (1) month before it expires. A full-time student is deemed to be residing illegally in Singapore if he/she does not have a valid Student's Pass.

According to the conditions stated by ICA, an international student must surrender the Student's Pass within 7 days of the date of cessation or termination of studies. Those who surrender at ICA (Visitor Services Centre, ICA Building Level 4) will be granted a short-term visit pass to allow them to exit the country. If you intend to leave Singapore upon completion of your studies, you may surrender it with a [cancellation form](#) to the Immigration Officer at the checkpoint. For students who are overseas, you may return the Student's Pass and cancellation form to ICA by registered post to the following address:

SkillsFuture Credit

1. Opening SkillsFuture Credit (SFC1)

The SkillsFuture Credit aims to encourage individuals to take ownership of their skills development and lifelong learning. All Singapore Citizens (SCs) aged 25 and above will receive an opening Credit of S\$500. There is no expiry date to this opening Credit.

Singapore Citizen students may use SFC1 to pay their tuition fees at SUSS.

2. Additional SkillsFuture Credit (Mid-Career Support)

As of 31 December 2020, a one-off SkillsFuture Credit of S\$500 is provided to every Singapore Citizen (SC) aged 40 to 60 (inclusive) to improve individuals' access to career transition programmes. Eligible individuals can use this additional credit on:

- i) SGUnited Skills Programme
- ii) SGUnited Mid-Career Pathways Programme - Company Training, and
- iii) Career Transition Programmes

The Additional SkillsFuture Credit (Mid-Career Support) can also be used for SkillsFuture Career Transition Programmes.

To provide more support for mid-career Singaporeans, the Government will provide a S\$4,000 SkillsFuture Credit (Mid-Career) top-up to all eligible Singaporeans in the year they turn 40 years old. The credit will have no expiry date.

Courses eligible under this SkillsFuture Mid-Career Support Package has been expanded with effect from 1 June 2022, including full qualification programmes delivered by Institutes of Higher Learning. The expiry date for this top-up will be lifted. Any balance from the 2020 top-up will be merged with the new S\$4,000 top-up.

3. Workfare Skills Support (WSS) (Level-Up)

[WSS \(Level-Up\)](#) supports eligible lower-wage Singaporeans aged 30 to 39 in pursuing long-form training that leads to better employment outcomes.

4. SkillsFuture Mid-Career Training Allowance

[SkillsFuture Mid-Career Training Allowance](#) supports eligible mid-career Singaporeans aged 40 and above to upskill and reskill by providing training allowance for selected long-form training.

The allowance will be based on 50% of one's average income over the latest available 12-month period, capped at S\$3,000 a month, for up to 24 months over an individual's lifetime.

Tuition Grant Scheme

The Tuition Grant scheme (TGS) was introduced by the Singapore Government to subsidise tertiary education in Singapore.

It is extended to Singapore Citizens, Singapore Permanent Residents and International Students enrolled in full-time undergraduate programmes at SUSS. Students who are awarded the TGS will pay the subsidised tuition fees.

All full-time Singaporean students will automatically be granted the Tuition Grant and no further action is required from you.

Singapore Permanent Resident and International Students (SPR/IS) who have opted to receive the Tuition Grant (TG) are required to do the following:

TG recipients (SPR/ IS) are required to work full-time for 3 years in a Singapore entity upon graduation.

IMPT: Students are expected to adhere to the deadline closely to avoid delayed processing of your TG application that could lead to you paying unsubsidised tuition fees.

Withdrawal

Students who wish to withdraw from the University must inform us by **9 Aug (Sun)**.

Submit the **completed Withdrawal Form** (included in this Matriculation Booklet) along with your **full name and PI No.** to ft_admissions@suss.edu.sg.

Refund Policy

For newly enrolled students, if written notice of withdrawal or deferment is given within 2 weeks of semester commencement, a full refund of the fees paid will be given. No refund will be given for withdrawal or deferment thereafter.

Current students who leave the University after the fee payment deadline for the semester, either through withdrawal on their own accord or termination of candidature by the University, will be liable to pay fees for the entire semester.

To expedite the administrative process, you are strongly encouraged to submit your notice of withdrawal or deferment to the University via SUSConnect.

Consumption of Tuition Grant

Students who withdraw from the University after semester commencement (i.e., 10 Aug for Academic Year 2026/2027), either through withdrawal on your own accord or termination of candidature by the University, will be liable to pay fees for the entire semester.

Commencement of semester includes attending classes (Face-to-Face or Online delivery mode), attempting Pre-Course Online Quiz (PCOQ), Pre-Class Quiz (PCQ), and/or any other activities which are listed in the credit-bearing course deliverables.

For such cases, **tuition grant awarded for these courses may be deemed as utilised**. The consumption of Tuition Grant and/or the refund policy will be reviewed upon receipt of student's withdrawal request or termination of candidature. This will impact withdrawn students' future Tuition Grant availability at other local universities, should you be enrolled in another undergraduate programme.
