About SUSS School of Law (SLAW)

- SLAW was established in 2016 as Singapore's third law school after the National University of Singapore (NUS) Faculty of Law and Singapore Management University (SMU) School of Law.

About SUSS Law & Youth Camp (SLYC)

This camp provides a platform for Secondary School students to learn about Singapore's legal system, fundamental legal concepts and selected youth-related legal issues, through a series of engaging workshops and a quiz competition.

Aims and Objectives

- To introduce students to Singapore's legal system, general legal concepts, and selected youth-related legal issues.
- To develop analytical and critical thinking, as well as communication and problem-solving skills.
- To foster teamwork and healthy competition by enabling students to collaborate, challenge and showcase their legal knowledge.

What will students gain?

1. Learn legal knowledge that is close to students' daily lives - Understand how the law applies to real-life situations that students might encounter, from contracts and social media regulations to rights and responsibilities in everyday scenarios. A ***camp handbook*** will be provided to students on the day itself.

2. Experience ***fun and engaging sessions*** with our faculty, who are also experienced lawyers and practitioners. Our faculty members will break down complex legal issues into easy-to-follow concepts, and facilitate interactive discussions and discourse, for a more interesting and insightful learning experience.

SLYC 2026 Programme (Saturday, 25 July 2026)

1) Workshops

- A total of 4 interactive workshops conducted by SLAW Academic Faculty.
- Topics include the introduction of Singapore's legal system, civil law, criminal law and family law.

2) Quiz Competition

- 1st round: All teams will participate in the first round of quiz which comprises 30 multiple-choice questions, ranging from topics covered in the workshops. The top 8 teams with the highest scores will progress to the 2nd round of the quiz competition.
- 2nd round: The top 8 teams will compete in a new round of quiz comprising of 20 multiple-choice questions and the top 3 teams with the highest scores will be awarded trophies.

All teams are advised to bring along one electronic device (e.g. tablet, laptop, smart phone) for the camp.

Prizes and Certificates

- All teams who take part in the SLYC 2026 will receive a Certificate of Participation.
- The top 8 teams who advance to the 2nd round will receive a Certificate of Merit.
- The top 3 teams will receive trophies in addition to the Certificate of Merit.

Registration

Registration Period: 15 May 2026 to 15 June 2026

Each school may send up to two teams, with each team consisting of three students.

The Teacher-in-charge should register on behalf of the School and participating students before the registration closing date, **15 June 2026**, by submitting the Registration Form, together with the Consent Forms.

Frequently Asked Questions

Who can participate?

- Each school may send up to two teams, with each team consisting of three students.
- Each team member must be in Secondary 3, 4 or 5 or IP Year 3 or 4. Team members do not need to be in the same Academic Level.

What information will schools or students need to provide to take part in this SLYC 2026?

- We will need the contact details of the teacher coordinator and students taking part in this SLYC 2026. Students are also required to submit a [Consent Form](#). Registration can be done [here](#).
- All relevant details will be disseminated to schools via emails to the teacher coordinator.

Do students need to have any legal knowledge to take part in this SLYC 2026?

- No. All registered students will be provided with a Camp Handbook on day itself. The handbook will include informative legal concepts and handouts of the workshops.

What do students need to bring when they attend the Camp?

- Each team is advised to bring one electronic device (e.g. tablet, laptop, smart phone) for various activities during the Camp.

Are we allowed to change team members after registration?

- Changing or replacement of team members is not allowed.

If a team member is absent during the Camp, will the team be disqualified?

- Unless there is a valid reason, members who are absent might be subjected to the team being disqualified.

Are students who have participated in the Camp last year allowed to sign up this year?

- While we welcome students who have participated last year to join us again, we also hope to extend this opportunity to as many students as possible, thus we encourage schools to nominate students who have not attended the Camp previously.
