

**Professional Readiness Experience
Learning Objectives
for Interdisciplinary Work Attachment (any Programme)**
(effective for students matriculated from year 2019 onwards)

1. Introduction

Professional Readiness Experience (PRE) includes both non-credit bearing 6-month Work Attachment (WA) and credit-bearing 1-year Work Study Degree programme. PRE is an experiential learning opportunity for students to enhance their employment readiness and employability through a supervised work placement with a Host Organisation (HO) in Singapore or overseas.

Students are encouraged to take on PRE opportunities relevant to their study disciplines or alternative pathways to gain valuable real-life work experiences and build up their interdisciplinary skills and competencies.

Students may be assigned multidisciplinary tasks and cross-functional projects. Where appropriate, students may seek the approval from Head of CDO for any reasonable departure from their approved job.

Students who pursue Interdisciplinary Work Attachment (I-WA) are encouraged to take on PRE opportunities that offer them exposure to or require them to apply their knowledge acquired from more than one study discipline to build their interdisciplinary skills and competencies. SUSS students may refer to the Professional Readiness Guidelines in the SUSS Career Portal.

2. Learning Outcomes

Work tasks in real-life working environments are often complex and interdisciplinary, requiring a combination of multidisciplinary knowledge and critical core skills and competencies to resolve.

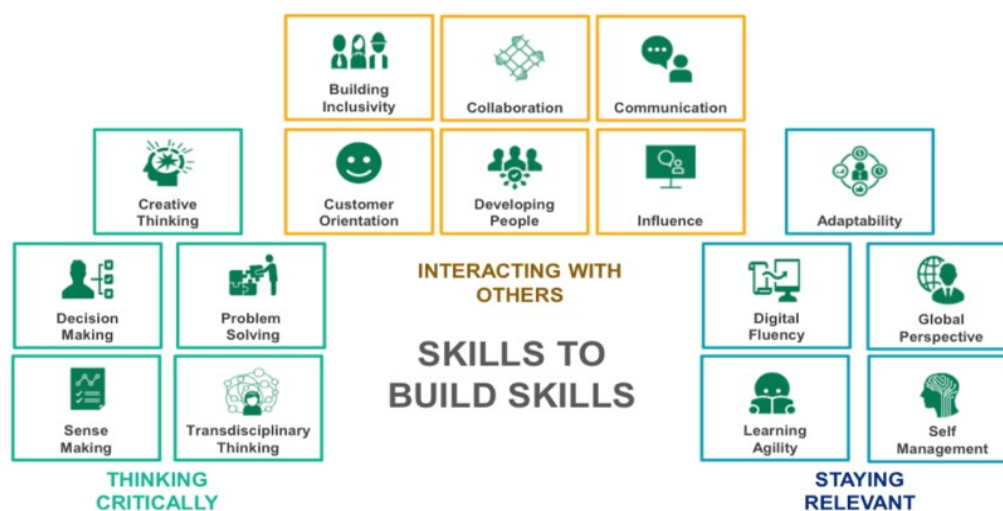
(B) Generic Learning Outcomes
