Programme Overview

The Master of Management (MMGT) programme aims to prepare business executives with the skills and knowledge to contribute to the effective management of organisations. The programme equips learners with 21st century skills and knowledge such as problem-solving, critical thinking, digital literacy, communication skills, as well as leadership capabilities, while ensuring that the need for sustainability, social responsibility and ethical practices are met.

The curriculum builds on the core foundation of business management. By embracing complementarities and knowledge exchange with other emerging disciplines and fields, students can gain a deeper perspective of the best practices in a specialisation of their choice, depending on their career lifecycle and evolution.

Unique Features of the Programme



The programme offers an immersive learning experience where students can explore global best practices and apply practical solutions to business and management challenges at their workplace.



The variety of specialisations afford maximum flexibility in course selection according to the student's individual preferences and interests.



It is stackable and thus in line with the national emphasis on stackable credentials that facilitate lifelong learning. Students may graduate with a graduate certificate, graduate diploma or master's degree in management.



The teaching and learning strategy of using real-world case studies and guest speakers help to inject more relevant and updated business and management knowledge in classes.



Possible Career Pathways

The programme supplements students' undergraduate area of expertise with business management knowledge and skills. Students have the option to select a business management track or a specialisation of their choice. The pursuit of a specialisation in an emerging discipline will dramatically increase students' employment prospects in their chosen field and help them position themselves in an increasingly ambiguous and uncertain business environment.

Programme Structure

To graduate with the Graduate Diploma in Management, students are required to complete 30 credit units (cu) consisting of twelve management courses (2.5 cu each), with the option to replace up to 10 cu with Graduate Unrestricted Electives and/or MOOC Electives.

To graduate with the Master of Management, students are required to complete 60 cu of courses. There are two tracks in the Master of Management, namely the management and specialisation tracks. The curriculum of the management track comprises of management courses (30 cu), a management consulting project (10 cu) and specialisation track courses (20 cu), which can be replaced by up to 10 cu of Graduate Unrestricted Electives and/or MOOC Electives.

Students who wish to pursue the Specialisation track will need to complete the Graduate Diploma in Management (30 cu) and another 30 cu of courses from a related specialisation.

Students have to maintain a minimum cumulative grade point average (CGPA) of 3.0 in their coursework in order to obtain the master's degree. Classes are conducted in the evenings during the weekdays or during the weekends, so students can continue to work in the day and study in the evening.

¹ Upon completion of 15 cu of management courses (not including electives), students will need a min. CGPA of 2.5 to be awarded Graduate Certificate in Management.

² Upon completion of 30 cu of courses, students will need a min. CGPA of 2.5 to be awarded Graduate Diploma in Management, and a min. CGPA of 3.0 to proceed to Master of Management.

³ Upon completion of 60 cu of courses, students will need a min. CGPA of 3.0 to be awarded Master of Management.

⁴ Students taking the Master of Management (Specialisation Track) can choose up to 10 cu of Graduate Unrestricted Electives/ MOOC Electives in lieu of management courses.

ADMINISTRATIVE DETAILS

Admission Criteria

Applicants must possess an undergraduate degree or an equivalent qualification from a recognised institution.

For SUSS graduate programmes that are conducted in the English Language, you must meet the English Language Proficiency Requirement (ELPR)* **if** your undergraduate degree is not awarded by an English-medium university, **or** your undergraduate degree is awarded by an English-medium university but the language of instruction was not English.

** at least an IELTS (Academic) score of 6.5, or a TOEFL score of 580 (paper-based) or 85 (internet-based), or a PTE Academic score of 58, or C1 Advanced score of 180 [score must be obtained within the last 2 years at point of application].*

Applicants with an undergraduate degree that was conducted in English but awarded by a non-English medium university must produce an official letter from the university to certify as such in order to seek waiver of the ELPR requirement.

In addition, please take note of the following:

- Applicants with relevant work experience but with other qualifications may be considered on an individual basis.
- Applicants with social outreach or volunteering experience have an added advantage.

Shortlisted applicants will be required to undergo one or more interviews and/or take such written admission or other evaluation tests as may be prescribed by SUSS from time to time.

All applications are considered individually on merit, and the offer of admission is dependent on the number of places available in individual programmes. Admission is solely at the discretion of SUSS and the decision is final and binding. SUSS reserves the right to refuse admission and is not obliged to offer an explanation for the non-admission of unsuccessful candidates.

Tuition Fees

The amount of course fees you pay in each semester depends on the number of courses you take in that semester. The course fees cover all study materials, classes, tutor supervision, assignments and examinations. They do not include fees for textbooks and other additional items specified by SUSS from time to time.
