Synopsis:

Shipping is essential to the world economy accounting for the bulk of all freight transported across oceans and through waterways. This course equips students with an understanding of the role of ocean freight in the maritime transport system and international trade, freight conferences and international conventions as well as rules, regulations and laws that govern the industry. It examines the operational and managerial aspects of the ocean freight industry from ship specifications, containerisation, cargo handling and documentation to maritime economics and ship management. The course also examines important issues related to security and ship chartering systems.
